



Good quality child care is good for children & families



For children: Good child care helps your child to:

- play with other children
- develop friendships with other children
- be creative
- explore
- learn
- practice English

Good child care welcomes all children!

"I love my children's current child care. The environment is lovely and the teachers are very caring. They have different activities to provide stimulation ... according to their age."

For parents: Good child care means you know your child is happy, healthy and learning in a safe place.

In good child care you can:

- get information about other programs and services in your community
- meet other parents to learn from and get support
- ask child care providers questions because they have special training and make you feel comfortable

Parents who work or go to school often use child care.

IMPORTANT TIPS!

- Take the time to look at different child care places before deciding on one. You have a choice!
- Take the time to speak with the child care staff. For example, you can ask: How many staff work here? What do children do all day?
- Take time to look around the place. Is it clean? Is it safe? Ask questions!
- Make sure you feel comfortable where you leave your child!
